Sometimes persistence pays off. One of the things I try and do when I ever get to my favorite bookstore, Half Price Books, is to look in the collectible section for philatelic books. Most of the time it is hit and miss. I have found albums reasonable priced and some very overpriced. Sometime you will find catalogs, most old and overpriced. Often, you will find nothing. Most of the time there will be more books about coin collecting, collecting dolls or collecting rugs! But I always look, just in case I find a great deal.

I found that great deal this past November (I will not tell you which Half Price Books I was at). While perusing the collectables section for stamp books, I thought I had found a great deal. My find were three hard bound copies of William H. Gross auction catalogs by Spinks-Shreve auctions. I was in heaven, what a great set of full color auction catalogs to add to my philatelic library! Two of the auction catalogs were from Mr. Gross' Great Britain collection that was sold to benefit Doctors Without Borders. The other auction catalog was from the Gross Scandinavia collection benefiting the Millennium Village Project for the Earth Institute. All three books were shrink wrapped, never ever opened. Each book was



listed at \$7.95 each. A great deal because the catalogs usually go for \$20 a piece. As I gathered up my find, I saw the spine of a book that also had the name of William H. Gross. It was larger than the Auction catalogs. I pulled it out, and listed at \$12.95, I found a copy of the William H. Gross Collection of U.S. Classics, 1847-1869. Bingo! This was the same book that Charles Shreve gave away at his lecture in June. The same book that Harry Pedersen won! I added this book to my three other auction catalogs and made my way to the cash register! Later when I got home, I looked up the U.S. Classics book on the Collectors Club of New York website (. The book goes for \$80, postage paid. I sure found a bargain that evening at Half Price Books!

So the next time you go to a used book store, be on the lookout for a great bargain. You may get lucky, you may find nothing. I have found that persistence has paid off.**-Doug Moss**.
