USPS ANNOUNCES PROPOSED TEMPORARY RATE ADJUSTMENTS FOR 2022 PEAK HOLIDAY SEASON

From the USPS Newsroom

WASHINGTON — The United States Postal Service filed notice on August 11 with the Postal Regulatory Commission (PRC) regarding a temporary price adjustment for key package products for the 2022 peak holiday season. This temporary rate adjustment is similar to ones in past years that help cover extra handling costs to ensure a successful peak season.

The planned peak-season pricing, which was approved by the Governors of the Postal Service on Aug. 9, would affect prices on the following commercial and retail domestic competitive parcels: Priority Mail Express (PME), Priority Mail (PM), First-Class Package Service (FCPS), Parcel Select and USPS Retail Ground. International products would be unaffected. Pending favorable review by the PRC, the temporary rates

would go into effect at 12 a.m. Central on Oct. 2, and remain in place until 12 a.m. Central Jan. 22, 2023.

This seasonal adjustment will bring prices for the Postal Service’s commercial and retail customers in line with competitive practices. No structural changes are planned as part of this limited pricing initiative.

Delivering for America, the Postal Service’s 10-year plan for achieving financial sustainability and service excellence, calls for appropriate pricing initiatives. The Postal Service has some of the lowest postage rates in the industrialized world and continues to offer great values in shipping. These temporary rates will keep USPS competitive while providing the agency with the revenue to cover extra costs in anticipation of peak-

ROYAL MAIL ANNOUNCES CHANGES FOLLOWING THE QUEEN'S DEATH

On Sept. 9, Great Britain's Royal Mail issued guidance on stamps and public mail boxes (called post boxes in the United Kingdom) following the death of Queen Elizabeth II on Sept. 8.

All of Great Britain's commemorative stamps that have already been announced will still be issued, although the issue dates may change, Royal Mail said. Royal Mail said it will make further announcements on stamps after consulting with Buckingham Palace once the appropriate amount of time has passed after the funeral.

Royal Mail confirmed that stamps bearing the image of the queen remain valid for use. These include definitive stamps and commemorative stamps.

On postboxes, Royal Mail said, "In line with past practice, following the death of a monarch all existing post boxes will remain unchanged. Post boxes already in production or being prepared for installation, will also retain the insignia of Queen Elizabeth II. Once these have been installed, new postboxes will feature the cypher of King Charles III."

The insignia "E II R" is depicted on the mailbox to the right. E stands for "Elizabeth", R for the Latin "Regina" which means "Queen". "II" denotes this Elizabeth the second. The insignia for

King Charles is illustrated at left. C stands for "Charles" and R for "Rex", Latin for "King".

The Royal Mail also said that the current image of Queen Elizabeth used on everyday stamps will be updated to feature an image of King Charles. "His Majesty will appear on new 1st and 2nd Class Definitive stamps, as well as all those of other values," the organization said. "New stamps featuring King Charles will enter circulation once current stocks of stamps are exhausted."

The organization is also issuing four new portrait stamps in memory of Queen Elizabeth which feature her at different stages throughout her reign. They will go on sale in November and can be pre-ordered at royalmail.com.

MORE COUNTRIES ISSUE STAMPS TO SUPPORT UKRAINE

In the last issue, we reported on countries issuing stamps in support of Ukraine: Poland, Latvia, Estonia, Austria and Croatia. Several more countries have also issued stamps in support of Ukraine.

Lithuania and Spain issued stamps



emphasizing their friendship with Ukraine. The text on the Lithuanian semipostal below translates to “In de-



fense of the freedom of Ukraine”. The Spanish stamp below simply says “With Ukraine”. It is valid for the C rate.

Canada and France emphasize aid



to Ukraine in their stamps. France’s semipostal stamp below specifies a donation 0.84 euros to the Red Cross in addition to the Green Letter rate. The inscription reads: “United in the Ukrainian crisis”. Canada has issued a semi-postal stamp (below) in booklet format simply



requesting help for Ukraine, in English and French.



Luxembourg and Moldova ask for peace in Ukraine in their stamps. Neither mentions Ukraine explicitly, but the Luxembourg stamp, at left, is designed in the colors of the Ukrainian flag.

The Moldova



stamp does not specifically support Ukraine, but merely advocates peace between Ukraine and Russia. The stamp (below) illustrates a white dove with blue and red wings, with yellow heart at the beak. The white, blue and red are the colors of the Russian flag, and the blue

and yellow colors are those of the Ukrainian flag. The inscription translates to “Moldova for Peace”.

Trivia/Show & Tell — Rick Hosler reported the July 26 was the 247 anniversary of the appointment of Benjamin Franklin first American Postmaster General (July 26, 1775). Among his accomplishments included standardizing postal rates and mail routes, and reducing delivery time for mail between major cities.

Program — Paderewski: Great Pianist and Statesman. Stan Bartnikowski provided a fascinating history of Ignacy Jan Paderewski and his role in the creation of the new Poland after WW I. He became the spokesman for the new independent Poland and in 1919 as Prime Minister he signed the Treaty of Versailles ending WW I. He used his fame as a pianist and composer to seek assistance from the US to help the struggling post war Polish population. He was the first pianist to perform at Carnegie Hall. When the Nazis invaded Poland, he became the President of the Polish Government in Exile in 1940. There are various stamps honoring Paderewski including the 1960 US 4 & 8 cent Champion of Liberty issue. He appears on the 1941 POLOPEX Souvenir Sheet.

QUEEN ELIZABETH II MEMORIAL ISSUES ANNOUNCED BY IGPC

The new-issue agent Inter-Governmental Philatelic Corporation announced on Sept. 8 that 10 nations it represents will issue memorial stamps for Queen Elizabeth II.

The queen died on Sept. 8 at Balmoral Castle in Scotland.

A time frame for the issuance of the stamps has not been announced.

The participating countries are Antigua and Barbuda, The Gambia, Grenada, Guyana, Marshall Islands, Nevis, Papua New Guinea, St. Kitts, St. Vincent and the Grenadines, and Tuvalu. More countries are expected to participate, according to IGPC.

Pictured below is preliminary artwork for the Tuvalu souvenir sheet of four with memorial text at the top. Two stamps show photos of the queen, and the other two feature photos of the queen and Prince Philip.

IGPC said that these new stamps will be available from post offices in the issuing countries, from stamp dealers and through its website, www.igpc.com.
